






How To Copy A Sign

1. Select the sign in the document:



2. Type Alt-C. A copy of the sign appears to the right:




3. Type Alt-S again to "de-select" the brackets surrounding the original sign.




To Copy A Sign From A Document Into The Dictionary

1. Select the sign in the document:


Selected Sign



2. Open the dictionary by typing Alt-D. The Dictionary window opens:



3. Type the new word description for the sign.








Dict | Use PgUp and PgDn to browse through dictionary

5. Type Alt-C for Copy. The sign is pasted into the Sign Window.



6. Press the Escape Key. The sign is now stored in the dictionary. Want to be sure it is in the dictionary? Open the Dictionary again to check if it is there!
