Comments on accommodation and on how to get there:

Searches for accommodation could be in the WC1 (West-Central 1)

area of London, but the London underground (tube) system allows travel from cheaper accommodation. The nearest tube stations to Gordon Square are Euston Square, Warren Street, Russell Square or Goodge Street.

You can access a map by going to www.multimap.com, choose the country as 'Great Britain & NI', then search for postal code WC1H 0AG.

There are a number of hotels for £114 for two nights. A Google search for 'accommodation london WC1 cheap' will find some of these.

If you go to <http://www.bedandbreakfasts.co.uk/uk-london.asp> and choose W1 or, say, N1 you will find cheaper options. In the W1 area there is one bed & breakfast accommodation for £28 per night and two others for £40 per night. Getting a bit further out of London should reduce accommodation costs, but increase travel costs.

If attendees arrive at London Heathrow Airport or London City Airport, they will be able to get the tube straight into London. Other London Airports are far less convenient.

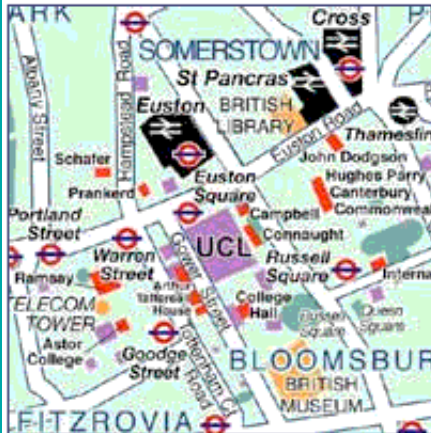

The DCAL department is within easy reach of central London next to two tube stations and many bus stops:



Euston Underground (Northern and Victorian Line) and Euston Rail Station

From Euston train station exit onto Euston Road, turn right and cross over to the other side of the road.

Take the first left down Gordon Street and then the first left onto Gordon Square. Number 49 is at the opposite diagonal, either cut through the Gardens or walk round the Square.
