





Verse 2. You don't need further instruction about baptisms, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. Verse 3. And so, God willing, we will move forward to further understanding. Verse 4. For it is impossible to bring back to repentance those who were once enlightened -- NLT

Verse 11. Our great desire is that you will keep on loving others as long as life lasts, in order to make certain that what you hope for will come true. Verse 12. Then you will not become spiritually dull and indifferent. Instead, you will follow the example of those who are going to inherit God's promises because of their faith and endurance. NLT



Verse 15. Then Abraham waited patiently, and he received what God had promised. Verse 16. Now when people take an oath, they call on someone greater than themselves to hold them to it. And without any question that oath is binding. Verse 17. God also bound himself with an oath, so

that those who received the promise could be perfectly sure that he would never change his mind. Verse 18. So God has given both his promise and his oath. These two things are unchangeable because it is impossible for God to lie. Therefore, we who have fled to him for refuge can have great confidence NLT
