SignWriting is a way to read and write body movement. It is an alphabet for writing the handshapes, facial expressions, movements and punctuation of any Sign Language. It is becoming the daily writing system for movement-based languages around the world.

Studies show that SignWriting helps Deaf students learn to read and write spoken languages better, as well as giving Deaf people a feeling of pride and self-worth when writing the poetry and literature of their own native signed languages.

SignWriting is free to use, with several large web sites with thousands of free documents
